Senator Carr, Kim (L&CA 133) asked:

Senator KIM CARR: Was St Stephen invited to apply for SVP status?

Mr Wilden: Again, I would have to take that on notice.

Senator KIM CARR: What was the date of their application and what was the date of their

approval?

Mr Wilden: I will come back to you.

Senator KIM CARR: And how were they assessed to be eligible? Can you tell me how many students went through this particular RTO and could you provide that on a yearly basis?

Mr Wilden: From when they first commenced as an SVP?

Senator KIM CARR: Yes. I presume they would still have provided visas on the non-SVP

stream. There would have had to have been some assessments.

Mr Wilden: We will have to check that.

Senator KIM CARR: Thank you. I would like a breakdown.

Mr Wilden: We will provide the breakdown from when the commenced and under both stream

SVP and non-SVP assuming they have both those categories.

Answer:

St Stephen Institute of Technology Pty Ltd was invited to apply to become an eligible provider in July 2014. St Stephen Institute of Technology Pty Ltd was approved to participate in streamlined visa processing arrangements from 23 November 2014.

St Stephen Institute of Technology Pty Ltd met the requirements to enter into the arrangements outlined in the guidelines available at www.border.gov.au/Busi/Educ/Stre.

From 23 November 2014 until their removal from the arrangements on 15 August 2015, Departmental data showed five applications were processed under the streamlined visa processing arrangements for St Stephen Institute of Technology Pty Ltd.

The below table shows the number of primary student visas granted in the last three years to students who submitted a confirmation of enrolment from St Stephen Institute of Technology Pty Ltd. Where more than one confirmation of enrolment is recorded, the education provider is based on the highest course level.
