Senator Birmingham asked:

For both calendar year 2010 and financial year 2010-11 to date:

1. How many Department of Climate Change and Energy Efficiency staff travelled overseas? Please detail by staff member, including their name and position and their total travel expenses.
2. What was the total cost of overseas travel for the Department? Please include a list of all international travel itemised by trip, detailing the number of Departmental staff involved and the cost of each trip including the total amounts spent on accommodation and meals, cities or other destinations visited, the purpose of the travel and any specific outcomes achieved.
3. What was the total amount spent by the Department on overseas accommodation and meals?
4. How many staff travelled first class?
5. How many travelled business class?
6. How many staff travelled interstate?
7. What was the total accommodation and meals bill for staff travelling interstate over the past year?
8. How many future overseas trips is the Department currently planning?

Answer:

The Department of Climate Change and Energy Efficiency advises that:

1. 86 staff travelled overseas in the 2010 calendar year, and 68 staff members travelled overseas between 1 July 2010 and 28 February 2011 (the latest reporting cut-off date for this financial year). Please refer to Attachment A for travel for the 2010 calendar year and Attachment B for travel between 1 July 2010 and 28 February 2011.

Please note information in the attachment has been listed according to the Australian Public Service (APS) level of the staff members who have undertaken travel covered by this question. The attachment has not specified the names of the staff members.

2. The total cost of overseas travel for the Department was \$3,141,633.61 in the 2010 calendar year and \$1,835,594.05 between 1 July 2010 and 28 February 2011. Please refer to Attachment C for an itemised list of all international travel for the 2010 calendar year and Attachment D for all international travel between 1 July 2010 and 28 February 2011. Specific outcomes for each trip are not recorded in the Department's travel system.

Please note information in the attachment has been listed according to the APS level of the staff members who have undertaken travel covered by this question. The attachment has not specified the names of the staff members.

3. The total amount spent by the Department on overseas accommodation and meals in the 2010 calendar year was \$738,728.46. The total amount spent between 1 July 2010 and 28 February 2011 was \$457,728.03.
4. One staff member travelled first class in December 2010.
5. 84 staff members travelled business class overseas in the 2010 calendar year and 62 staff members travelled business class overseas between 1 July 2010 and 28 February 2011.
6. 553 staff travelled interstate in the 2010 calendar year and 445 staff travelled interstate between 1 July 2010 and 28 February 2011.
7. The total accommodation and meals bill for staff travelling interstate in the 2010 calendar year was \$379,449.50. The total accommodation and meals bill for interstate travel between 1 July 2010 and 28 February 2011 was \$179,778.57.
8. As at 28 February 2011, the Department is planning 27 overseas trips.

Senator Birmingham asked:

Why has the Department's legal bill increased from \$4.5 million in 2008-09 to \$6.1 million in 2009-10?

Answer:

The Department's legal bill increased from \$4.5 million in 2008-09 to \$6.1 million in 2009-10 primarily as a result of the machinery of government change which transferred the following functions to the Department: renewable energy programs; energy efficiency; greenhouse gas abatement programs; and community and household climate action. These functions required substantial input from legal services.

In 2009-10, the Department also produced a number of outcomes (such as refining the policy design for the Carbon Pollution Reduction Scheme and its supporting legislation and regulations, and the enhanced Renewable Energy Target scheme) that required an increase in legal services expenditure.
