## Senator Urquhart asked:

Senator URQUHART: Before the election, the government stated that it would honour existing and committed contracts under the Tasmanian Forests Intergovernmental Agreement. Can you update the committee on whether all these contracts have been honoured—more broadly, spending the \$330 million under the 2013 IGA on track as budgeted? Mr Thompson: We might take on the notice the particulars of whether those individual commitments are still being honoured. But you are right, Senator, in saying that the government did commit to honour existing commitments. The reason I am taking it on notice is that, as I have indicated before, under the intergovernmental agreement there is a whole series of lines of different commitments. Could I answer that properly on notice? Senator URQUHART: If you can take that on notice, that would be great.

## Answer:

The status of Commonwealth funding under the Tasmanian Forests Intergovernmental Agreement 2013 is provided in the table below.
