Department of Sustainability, Environment, Water, Population and Communities

The department provides staff with opportunities to access job related learning and individual career development activities, including: in-house training organised and/or delivered by divisions, expert areas of the department (for example financial management and procurement) and the central workforce development function; training and development sourced externally to the department; and support to undertake external study through educational institutions. Currently the department does not have a mechanism to centrally capture and record details of all learning and development (L&D) activities undertaken by staff members, nor the total expenditure on this function. Efforts are underway to improve the capture of data that is related to individual staff member participation in L&D activities delivered internally and externally.

However, while it is not possible to give a comprehensive report on L&D activity and expenditure across the department, it is possible to report on training packages organised and/or delivered through the department's central workforce development function. These represent an important component of the training and development activities in which staff may have participated over the past year and are reported in (a) below. (Note that the department's Leadership Development Program expenditure is included in both this response and the response to the Executive Coaching and Leadership Training question, therefore the expenditure appears in responses to both questions).

In addition, under the department's Enterprise Agreement, staff members may apply for study support involving study leave during normal working hours and a bursary of between \$1250 and \$2500 per annum depending on the type of course. Expenditure on study support is reported in (b) below, excluding the value of the leave component. (It should be noted that in a small number of cases, the full costs of a course may have been met by the department for a participant – including for eligible Indigenous staff members as a specific condition of the Enterprise Agreement. However such instances will not have been captured in the data provided here due to devolved responsibility for, and the absence of central reporting on, this arrangement).

The department currently does not have a mechanism to centrally capture and record details of all learning and development activities undertaken by staff members, including coaching and leadership training, nor the total expenditure on this function.

However, through its central workforce development function, the department offers the Leadership Development Program to Executive Level 1 and 2 staff members and a program with a similar focus to APS 6 staff, Building Productive Partnerships. Information on these programs is reported below. While staff members may have participated in other, external leadership development training, funded at a divisional level, accurate reporting can only be provided in regard to the department's own Leadership Development Program.

In regard to executive coaching services, the Leadership Development Program has a coaching component which is accessed by all participants and information on this is incorporated in the report below. Each participant receives three hours of one-to-one coaching as part of the program. It should be noted that in a small number of instances executive coaching services have also been accessed for individual officers by the divisions outside of the Leadership Development Program. However, currently the department does not have a mechanism to centrally capture and record details of coaching events, and at the divisional level records may not identify that a particular training activity was in fact a coaching event.
