Senator Campbell asked:

Is the Department considering other schemes to reduce the compliance burden?

ANSWER

The Department is investigating proposals to reduce the red tape associated with ABN and business name registration and searching for trade marks. The project is being undertaken in consultation with a number of other Government agencies, including the Australian Taxation Office and the Australian Securities and Investments Commission.

The Department is also leading the development of a new-to-business checklist that will provide information on the regulations small businesses need to comply with when starting out. It is expected that this will encompass information from all levels of government.

Both of the above initiatives will require further consultation and cooperation with state and territory governments.
