AusIndustry is a nationally networked organisation with 22 offices across Australia – seven state and territory offices and 15 in regional centres. The majority of AusIndustry programs are available to business Australia wide and are delivered across the network i.e. each office is involved in program delivery in their geographical area. AusIndustry manages it's delivery resources flexibly to meet peaks and troughs in demand and the variability of resource use over the life of a program rather than allocating a precise number of staff to each program. A breakdown of staff by office location is at Attachment B.

- f. The listed programs/entities have different, and complementary, functions and objectives. There may be companies that access different programs and/or services available through Business Enterprise Centres, Enterprise Connect, AusIndustry and the Industry Capability Network. The Supplier Access to Major Projects program does not fund companies. It funds existing networks, predominantly the state industry Capability Network offices, to connect Australian companies with major project supply opportunities.
