On what date did the Government decide to withdraw from its commitment of \$22 million to the IBM Research Lab in Melbourne and what were the reasons for the discontinuation of this funding?

ANSWER

A Labor Party campaign media release of 14 August 2010 indicated that as part of additional savings measures a Federal Labor Government "will no longer proceed with ... a possible contribution to the establishment of an ICT-enabled laboratory." (Source: Campaign Media Release, Deputy Prime Minister, Minister for Finance Campaign Spokesperson, 14 August 2010)

The commitment was an unannounced "Expense measure since the Economic Statement" and was listed in the Pre-election Economic and Fiscal Outlook (PEFO) as the Establishment of an ICT-enabled research laboratory – Commonwealth assistance.

While not identified at the time, this savings measure referred to the establishment of an IBM Global Research & Development Laboratory at the University of Melbourne. Upon retaining office, the Government took a decision to fund the Laboratory at the originally proposed amount of \$22 million. Commonwealth funding was publicly announced on 14 October 2010.
