How many low-SES students attend higher education courses at non-university higher education providers, both in total and broken down by state/territory and provider (where available)?

ANSWER

The latest available data on low-SES student numbers are for 2010, which show 5,417 low-SES students studying at non-university higher education providers in Australia, representing 14.2 per cent of the domestic student population at those providers approved under the *Higher Education Support Act 2003 (HESA)*. Private providers not approved under *HESA* are not included.

A detailed breakdown for individual providers is at Attachment 1.
