Senator BUSHBY asked:

- 299. For the financial year to date, please detail all travel (itemised separately) undertaken by employees of each department and agency within each portfolio. Include details of what the travel was for, what cost was spent on travel (including business travel type i.e. business airfare), accommodation, security, food, beverages (alcohol listed separately), gifts, entertainment, and all other expenses.
- 300. Are employees taking the most direct route when travelling? If not, please explain why.
- 301. Are lounge memberships provided to any employees? If yes, what lounge memberships, to how many employees and their classification, the reason for the provision of lounge membership and the cost per employee.
- 302. When SES employees travel, do any support or administrative staff (such as their Executive Assistant) travel with them? If yes, provide details of why such a staff member is needed and the costs of the support staff travel.

Answer:

299. Total domestic flight expenditure from 1 July 2011 to 31 January 2012 was \$18,830. Total international flight expenditure from 1 July 2011 to 31 January 2012 was \$54,091. Our reporting system is not able to break down classes of travel – it should be assumed that all international travel is business class.

Total domestic travel allowance expenditure from 1 July 2011 to 31 January 2012 was \$21,888. Total international travel allowance expenditure from 1 July 2011 to 31 January 2012 was \$24,416. These amounts are inclusive of accommodation, meals and incidentals. Alcohol, gifts and entertainment are not paid to staff and are not included in these figures.
