1087. List the current inventory of computers owned, leased, stored, or able to be accessed by the department, listing the equipment cost and location.

1087. The following equipment is made available to staff of the Australian Prudential Regulation Authority (APRA):

1088. APRA utilises the Volume Sourcing Agreement coordinated by the Department of Finance, to cover both the desktop licensing and software assurance for that software.

APRA is currently running Microsoft Windows 7 Enterprise on its desktops and laptops. The costs associated with this are primarily covered by the Core Desktop Licensing Agreement that is managed by the Department of Finance. The expected cost of this arrangement is \$126,522.00.
