For each of the last four financial or calendar years for which this information is available:

a) what was the average number of sick leave days taken per full-time equivalent (FTE) employee;

b) what was the average number of days of unscheduled absence (encompassing all types of leave) taken per FTE employee.

ANSWER

The average numbers of sick leave days per Tourism Australia FTE employee are set out in the following table. The average number of days of other unscheduled absences taken per FTE employee is not available. The Human Resources function was previously outsourced and information regarding other unscheduled absences was not recorded.
