QUESTION No.BI-54

Senators Campbell and Sherry asked:

How many women own a small business in Australia?

ANSWER

It is estimated that 529,000 women own a non-agricultural small business in Australia. (Source: ABS Cat. No. 8127.0, 2004, Characteristics of Small Business.)

QUESTION No.BI-55

Senators Campbell and Sherry asked:

How many women are employees in a small business?

ANSWER

There are 3,783,900 female employees in Australian business in total. There is no estimate available of how many of these are employed by a small business. (Source: ABS Cat. No. 6105.0, August 2005, Labour Market Estimates.)

QUESTION No.BI-56

Senators Campbell and Sherry asked:

What is the average age of women who own a small business?

ANSWER

The average age of a female non-agricultural small business owner is 44 years. (Source: ABS Cat. No. 8127.0, 2004, Characteristics of Small Business, unpublished data.)

Can you provide a breakdown of the age of women operating a small business?

ANSWER

Can you provide a breakdown of the industries operated by female small business owners?

ANSWER

An industry breakdown of small businesses owned by females is not available. However the following table provides a breakdown by industry of all businesses owned by females. As small businesses comprise approximately 97 per cent of all businesses, the data is indicative of the industries in which female-owned small businesses are operating.

QUESTION No.BI-59

Senators Campbell and Sherry asked:

Can you provide a breakdown of the number of women operating a small business in metro, regional, rural and remote areas?

ANSWER

No estimates are available from ABS sources.

QUESTION No.BI-60

Senators Campbell and Sherry asked:

Does the department offer any funding or support specifically for female operators of small business?

ANSWER

The Office of Small Business does not offer any funding or support specifically for female operators of small business. However, funding for business skills development projects for female small business operators is available via the Building Entrepreneurship in Small Business Program. Female small business operators can also participate in other departmental programs.

QUESTION No.BI-61

Senators Campbell and Sherry asked:

Has the number of female small business owners risen, fallen or remained stable over the last decade – and can you provide that data to the committee?

ANSWER

The number of female non-agricultural small business operators increased from 424,300 in February 1995 to 529,000 in June 2004. This represents an increase in absolute terms, however the proportion of small business operators who are female has dropped slightly from 33.9 per cent in February 1995 to 31.9 per cent in June 2004.
