Senator SHERRY asked:

Aim -
The find out if research has been done by the ABS into various aspects of childcare.

## Questions -

(1) Data from the Australian Labour Market Statistics (Cat. No. 6105.0) shows there were $10,017,000$ employed persons in Australia in November 2005, of which $8,746,600$ were employees. Is that the most up-to-date data you have and if so, can you provide this data to this Committee?
(2) Does the ABS keep data on child care expenses of parents employed as an employee and if so can you provide that data to this Committee?
(3) Do you have data specifically detailing the role of child care in the CPI and if so, can you provide it to this Committee?

## Answer:

(1) The ABS advises that in May 2006, there were an estimated 10,142,200 employed persons in Australia, of which 8,894,900 were employees. Source: Labour Force, Australia, Detailed Electronic Delivery (ABS cat. no. 6291.0.055.001-Table 8).
(2) The ABS advises that summary data on household expenditure on childcare are available from the ABS Household Expenditure Survey. In 2003-04, in households with children under 12 years of age and where at least one parent had employee income, the average weekly expenditure on all childcare by those households reporting childcare expenses was $\$ 51.86$.

The ABS also advises that its Child Care Survey (conducted every three years) provides a range of information on the child care expenses of families in Australia. Summary results are available free of charge on the ABS website (see Child Care, Australia, June 2005.ABS cat. no. 4402.0), which includes a glossary and explanatory notes for the survey.

Data on child care expenses of employees are provided below in 23 tables compiled from the child care surveys conducted in June 1993, March 1996, June 1999, June 2002 and June 2005.

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## Notes to the tables:

For 1993, 1996 and 1999 the data have been compiled for children aged 11 years or younger where either parent was an employee. For 2002 and 2005, the data have been compiled for children aged 11 years or younger where either parent had employee income. For these children:

- Table 1 in each year presents counts of children receiving any care, classified by the type of care they received and the weekly cost of that care.
- Table 2 in each year presents counts of children receiving any care, classified by the reported cost of care and the hours of care received.
- Table 3 in each year (except 1993 for which this detail is not available) presents counts of families (where at least one parent is an employee as defined above), classified by the type of care that their children received and the weekly cost of that care.
- Table 4 in each year presents counts of children receiving formal care, classified by the reported cost of formal care and the hours of formal care received.

The tables are repeated for 2005 , extending the scope of children in care up to 12 years of age.

In the tables for 2002 and 2005, the cost of child care is net of the Child Care Benefit. Prior to 2002, there is insufficient information to determine whether the cost of child care information reported was net of any child care benefit.

For 2005 the data in Tables 1, 2 and 4 exclude attendance at preschools (adopting a standard definition of formal care that excludes preschools), while the data on the total costs to families of care in Table 3 includes preschool costs.

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(3) The ABS advises that indexes of childcare prices are published for each of the 8 capital cities each quarter as part of the Consumer Price Index (CPI). These prices reflect the changes in "out-of-pocket" prices for childcare (i.e. the net prices after taking account of subsidies that are applicable for families using child care). Childcare is a very small component of the CPI, with its weight accounting for only $0.45 \%$ of the "All Groups" CPI (15th Series CPI). Price indexes from March quarter 1982 to March quarter 2006 for childcare are shown in Consumer Price Index, Australia, March 2006 (ABS cat. no. 6401.0) available from the ABS web site at www.abs.gov.au.
