Senator ABETZ— ...Can I just ask you, if I did not ask you to take on notice, the exact date when the Department of Agriculture, Fisheries and Forestry indicated to the CSIRO that it was looking into this—do I call it a partnership—in relation to the announcement by Minister Burke on 21 May 2009 when that was sort of finalised?

Dr Keating—We can pull the time line out for you, Senator.

ANSWER

28/07/08	The Department of Agriculture, Fisheries and Forestry (DAFF) calls for proposals to the Australia's Farming Future Climate Change Research Program (advertised in newspapers and posted on the DAFF website).
05/09/08	CSIRO submits an expression of interest (EOI) to the Climate Change Research Program, including a project proposal on biochar.
	An expert panel reviews soil carbon projects for DAFF and the project principal investigators are notified.
01/12/08	CSIRO alerts DAFF to the fact that a review undertaken in conjunction with Rothamsted Research and funded by CSIRO will be published in early 2009 as <i>Biochar, climate change and soil: A review to guide future research.</i>
18/02/09	Biochar, climate change and soil: A review to guide future research is published.
03/03/09	The Hon Tony Burke MP, Minister for Agriculture, Fisheries and Forestry, announces the first round of successful projects under the Climate Change Research Program.
03/03/09	DAFF sends the CSIRO biochar project leader a letter advising that the project has been unsuccessful and that a gap analysis will be conducted to determine possible future investment: "The findings of the CSIRO report and other reviews will be analysed as part of a research gaps analysis, and may form the basis for future funding under the Climate Change Research Program."
06/05/09	DAFF officers contact CSIRO to review the schedule from the CSIRO biochar EOI, originally submitted on 5 September 2008.
21/05/09	Minister Burke announces funding for a collaborative biochar project, led by CSIRO, as part of the Australia's Farming Future Climate Change Research Program.
