Pending the Government's approval, the purpose of the Collaboration Development Program (CDP) is to support the early stage development of new collaborations between researchers and end-users and will provide grants of up to \$110,000 (GST inclusive) for one year. The total number of consortia supported in any one year would depend on the availability of funds. It is envisaged that up to five consortia could be supported in any one year.
