**Senator BUSHBY asked:** 

**Senator BUSHBY**—Can the commission indicate if the supermarket chains lodged a notification under the Trade Practices Act in relation to exclusive dealing involving the DVDs?

**Mr Samuel**—We are not aware that they have, Senator.

**Senator BUSHBY**—But you can check it and take it on notice, just to make sure? Thank you. Can you indicate the length of time it took to investigate the matter?

**Mr Cassidy**—Sorry?

**Senator BUSHBY**—The length of time it took to investigate.

Mr Bezzi—We received the matter on 9 December and we closed it on 24 March.

## **Answer:**

Supermarket chains have not lodged any exclusive dealing notifications in relation to general exclusive dealing conduct involving new release DVDs.

In the past, notifications have been lodged involving a specific promotion for the release of a particular movie. For example, Coles Supermarkets Australia Pty Ltd proposed to offer to customers the "Star Wars" Trilogy DVD box set at a discount of \$12.50 on condition the customer presents a discount coupon printed on the back of a Hoyts theatre ticket. The promotion commenced on 19 May 2005 and ended on 16 June 2005. This notification was allowed to stand on 11 May 2005.
