- 1. In relation to payments through the *Inspiring Australia* program, what amount in total has been committed to date? What has been spent to date, to whom it has been paid, and for what purpose in each case?
- 2. In total, how many individuals and organisations have applied for *Inspiring Australia* funding? How many individuals and organisations have been unsuccessful in seeking funding?

## **ANSWER**

- 1. Under the Inspiring Australia Program, as of 20 June 2012, a total of \$9,573,830 (GST exclusive) has been committed over the period 2011-12 to 2013-14. Of the funding committed, as of 20 June 2012, a total of \$4,794,281 has been spent in 2011-12 as follows:

- 2. There were two competitive grants rounds under the *Inspiring Australia* Program 2012 *National Science Week* and *Unlocking Australia's Potential*. The breakdown of the successful and unsuccessful application for the grants rounds was as follows:
  - *National Science Week* 142 applications from individuals and organisations. Of these applications, 104 were unsuccessful.
  - For the *Unlocking Australia's Potential* 278 applications from individuals and organisations. Of these applicants, 215 were unsuccessful.
