Could the Department provide a list of all discretionary grants, including ad hoc and one-off grants since Budget Estimates 2010? Please provide details of the recipients, the intended use of the grants and what locations have benefited from the grants.

Has the Department complied with interim requirements relating to the publication of discretionary grants?

Did the Minister approve each of these grants?

## **ANSWER**

The Department notes that the term 'discretionary grant' is no longer in use and that any 'interim requirements' have been superseded by the requirements detailed in the Commonwealth Grant Guidelines (CGGs) which took effect on 1 July 2009:

Noting the introduction of the CGGs on 1 July 2009, any interim arrangements have been replaced by the requirement that an agency must publish, on its website, information on its individual grants no later than seven working days after the funding agreement for the grant takes effect. There have been some instances where the Department has not met this requirement as there was a delay in the manual collation and publishing of the grant information on the website.

The Department introduced on 1 July 2010 a grants contract module in the Department Financial Information Management System (FMIS) which enables the grant contract information to be captured in the FMIS which has ensured information is collated and published within the require timeframe.
