The Department will make publicly available those parts of the Red Book that are not exempt under the *Freedom of Information Act 1982* and will make a claim for public interest immunity in relation to those parts that are exempt. It would be contrary to the public interest to disclose the exempt parts of the Red Book, as it would preclude the smooth transition from one government to the next and consideration by an incoming government of significant structural and policy issues.

- 8. The Department has received a FOI application for the "Blue Book" and is currently processing it. The Department makes a claim of public interest immunity in relation to parts of the Blue Book that contain deliberative material on the basis that disclosure of those parts of the Blue Book would be contrary to the public interest, as it would preclude the smooth transition from one government to the next and consideration by an incoming government of significant structural and policy issues.
