**Senator XENOPHON:** I just wanted to clarify that. Could you take this on notice, further to Senator Cameron's line of questioning: how many employees of the ATO, over the last five years, are in the \$100,000 to \$150,000 pay bracket and in the \$150,000 to \$200,000 and so on? I take it that would be a relatively small minority, but if I can get an idea of—

**Mr D'Ascenzo:** It is not a small minority because I think in the APS you would get to \$100,000 at the EL2 level, and we would have 1,500 EL2s.

Senator XENOPHON: Sure, but I am just trying to understand; so: for an organisation the size of the

ATO, in \$50,000 increments—again, on notice—and how it compares in the last five years.

Senator Sherry: I think that some of that data would be in the annual report.

Mr D'Ascenzo: All of it is in the annual report.

**Senator Sherry:** It is coming out in a couple of weeks, isn't it?

**Senator XENOPHON:** Perhaps the easiest thing to do, insofar as it is an annual report, if I am referred to

the annual report-

Mr D'Ascenzo: Yes, but I am not sure that the annual report will give a longitudinal—

**CHAIR:** The annual report will only have the SES in it.

**Senator Sherry:** We will take it on notice to the extent that what you have asked for is not in the annual report.
