## Senator Fifield asked:

With reference to Minister Macklin's press release of 10 August 2011, "Productivity Commission's Final Report into Disability Care and Support, which states that "the Government will convene a working group led by the Assistant Treasurer to work with State and Territory Governments, lawyers and other stakeholders to progress this important reform (a National Injury Insurance Scheme)":

- Has the working group led by the Assistant Treasurer to work with the states and territories to harmonise their approach to catastrophic injury convened yet?
  - a) If so, can Treasury provide details of those meetings, including date and location?
- 675. Who are the members of the working group?
- 676. How were members to the working group selected?
  - a) What were the criteria for membership of the Assistant Treasurer's working group?
- 677. What are the terms of reference for the working group?
- 678. When were terms of reference for the working group finalised?
- 679. What discussion was there at COAG about the National Injury Insurance Scheme?
- 680. Which stakeholders have been consulted by the working group regarding the NIIS and when were they consulted?
- 681. Which lawyers have been consulted by the working group regarding the NIIS?
- What expenditure has Treasury dedicated towards the development of a National Injury Insurance Scheme over the forward estimates?

- 683. How many staff are currently working on the development of a National Injury Insurance Scheme?
  - a) Can the Department provide a breakdown by APS level?
- 684. Can Treasury provide a breakdown of expenditure by the working group to date?
- 685. What outcomes does the NIIS working group have to deliver by the next COAG meeting?
- 686. How much of the \$10 million the Government has so far committed towards the technical policy work has been given to Treasury and the National Injury Insurance Scheme?

## Answer:

- Yes the advisory group has convened. Its first meeting was on 2 November 2011 at Parliament House in Canberra.
- 675. See Minister Shorten's press release of 2 November 2011 for membership of advisory group.
- 676. Membership of the group was determined by Minister Shorten.
- 677. There are no formal terms of reference for the group.
- 678. See answer to question 677
- 679. The August 2011 COAG communiqué noted the Productivity Commission's recommendations in relation to a National Injury Insurance Scheme and agreed to work together to consider the Productivity Commission's recommendation.
- 680. The advisory group comprises National Injury Insurance Scheme stakeholders and will be consulting with other stakeholders as appropriate.
- We are not aware that lawyers have been consulted by the advisory group, although there are two legal representatives on the advisory group.
- To date, no expenditure has been allocated by Treasury to the development of a National Injury Insurance Scheme over the forward estimates.
- 683. There are 3 staff currently spending a portion of their time assisting with the consideration of a National Injury Insurance Scheme.
  - a) EL2, APS 6, APS 4 with other staff assisting as necessary.
- 684. It is estimated that \$2,500 has been spent so far. This money was used for travel expenses for the first advisory group meeting.

- To date, the Treasury hasn't received any of the funds committed towards the technical policy work.
