- 1. In QoN AI-166, can the department please provide a further breakdown of these figures to demonstrate the number of students from regional areas in their 1st, 2nd, 3rd, 4th, 5th years of university accessing independent Youth Allowance, living away from home? (please break down into the ASGC-RA map). If this information is not available for the timeframe specified can it be provided for as many prior years as possible?
- 2. Can the same information be provided for regional areas receiving dependent Youth Allowance, living away from home?
- 3. Please advise the overall number of regional/rural students who are in their first, second, third, fourth and fifth year of university in 2011 and/or 12.
- 4. Can this information also be expressed as a percentage of the total number of students from all areas who are in their first, second, third, fourth and fifth year of university in 2011 and/or 2012?

ANSWER

- 1. and 2. Independent and dependent Youth Allowance data for AI-166 was provided by the Department of Education, Employment and Workplace Relations' Research Branch using their Research and Evaluation Database. The Research Branch has advised that the requested information on the breakdown of the estimates according to a student's year at university is not captured.
- 3. and 4. A total of 204 170 domestic students from regional areas enrolled in higher education in Australia in 2011 the latest available data. The table below provides a summary of the total number of students and those from regional areas who were in their first, second, third, fourth and fifth year of higher education study in 2011 and regional percentage figures.
