Senator Carr asked on 20 February 2004, EWRE Hansard page 45.

#### Question:

What are the reasons for the cancellations and conditional registrations for the providers listed in the first table of Attachment A (tabled by the Department)? I am looking for two things: the reasons for cancellations and the reason for conditions. Do you have that information?

#### Answer:

*Reasons for cancellations and imposing conditions*

#### Cancellation of Registration

1. Australian International College of Business Pty Ltd, 01749B – for breaches of the ESOS Act: section 8 - providing a course without a registered provider; section 15 - providers must not engage in misleading or deceptive conduct and section 19 - giving information about accepted students.
2. Australian College of Technology Pty Ltd, 02019F – for breaches of the ESOS Act: section 120 – failing to comply with a notice; section 19 – giving information about accepted students and section 20 – sending students notice of visa breaches.
3. College of International Business Pty Ltd, 01990D – for a breach of the ESOS Act: section 23 – payment of the annual registration charge.
4. Frankarens Pty Ltd, 02216A – breaches of the ESOS Act: section 8 – providing or promoting a course without a registered provider; section 15 – misleading and deceptive conduct; section 19 – giving information about accepted students; section 20 – sending students notices of visa breaches; section 107 – failing to identify the registered provider; and for breaches of the National Code: paragraph 14 – changes to registered provider details; paragraph 16 – educational resources and facilities; paragraphs 19 and 21 – marketing and student information and paragraph 39 – records of academic performance and attendance.
5. International Management Centres Association Limited, 01716M – for a breach of section 29 of the ESOS Act – refunds of course money.
6. New South Wales International College Pty Ltd, 01706B – for breaches of the ESOS Act: section 120 – failing to comply with a notice; section 29 – refunds; section 19 – giving information about accepted students; section 108 – providing false or misleading information and section 15 – registered providers must not engage in misleading or deceptive conduct.

7. Schutt Flying Academy (Australia) Pty Ltd, 01871M – for breaches of the ESOS Act: section 22 – registered providers must belong to a tuition assurance scheme; section 23 – payment of the annual registration charge; section 24 – payment of the annual ESOS Assurance Fund contributions and section 29 – refunds of course money.

### **Conditions on Registration**

1. International Management Centres Association Limited, 01716M – for a breach of the ESOS Act section 8 – providing or promoting a course without a registered provider.
2. Marrickville Commercial College Ltd, 00170D – for a breach of the ESOS Act section 120 – failing to comply with a notice and for breaches of the National Code: paragraphs 35, 37 and 39.1 – records of academic performance and attendance.
3. Australian International College Pty Ltd, 01731A – for breaches of the ESOS Act: section 19 – giving information about accepted students; section 20 – sending students notice of visa breaches and section 120 – failing to comply with a notice and for the breach of the National Code: paragraph 37 – records of academic performance and attendance.
4. Frankarens Pty Ltd, 02216A – for a breach of the ESOS Act 2000: section 19 – giving information about accepted students and for breaches of the National Code: paragraphs 35, 37 and 39.1 – records of academic performance and attendance.
5. Australian International College of Business Pty Ltd, 01749B – for breaches of ESOS Act: section 19 - giving information about accepted students; section 20 – sending students notice of visa breaches and section 120 – failing to comply with a notice and National Code paragraphs 37 and 39 – records of academic performance and attendance.
