Question:

Senator Webber asked at *Hansard* page 40:

- (a) Can the department provide the names of the organisations identified as having been refused permission to advertise on the Australian JobSearch web site?
- (b) Have any other organisations been refused permission since November 2003?
- (c) What vacancies were they trying to advertise?
- (d) Could the department provide a list of the occupation or the industry of vacancies that have been refused?

Answer:

- (a) No. The Australian JobSearch Conditions for Use provide that “information, such as a person's or organisation's name, will not be disclosed by the department without the consent of the person or organisation concerned”.
- (b) Yes. Four organisations.
- (c) The organisations were trying to lodge vacancies that breach the site's Conditions for Use. The site's Conditions for Use are available from a link on the site's home page.

(d) Occupations or industries refused include:

- Cleaning services
- Employment placement services
- Film and video production
- Furniture manufacturing
- Horse farming
- Manufacturing
- Painting and decorating services
- Personal services
- Roofing services
- Security and investigative services
- Travel agency services
