**Question:** 

Senator Wong asked in writing:

At page 168 of your annual report you note that your inquiry and compliance services are outsourced to State governments in Queensland, Western Australia, South Australia and Tasmania.

- (a) Is this a complete contracting out of the inquiry and compliance function in these States or do you retain some of these functions?
- (b) What is the value of these contracts in each relevant State? What has been the value of these contracts for each relevant State for each financial year since 1996-7?
- (c) What are the performance indicators required of the States in respect of these contracts?
- (d) How often are these contracts negotiated?
- (e) When will they next be renegotiated?

#### Answer:

(a) It is a complete contracting out of the function with the exception of targeted education and compliance activity.
