Senator Nettle provided in writing.

Question:

- a) What is the total amount of federal government subsidy to Notre Dame University, WA. Since its establishment in July 1991?
- b) Please supply a break down of those subsidies, by type and by year?
- c) What is the total of promised subsidies to the Notre Dame University over the forward estimates (including the proposed Sydney medical school)?
- d) Please supply a break down of those subsidies, by type and by year?
- e) What is the value of the projected HECS/FEE HELP subsidies to Notre Dame University students over the forward estimates period?
- f) What are the requirements for the University of Notre Dame to account for the public funds it receives?
- g) Are there any requirements for the University of Notre Dame to account for the funding it receives from private sources. What are those requirements?

Answer:

Notre Dame University

- a) The total amount of grants under the *Higher Education Funding Act 1988* and the *Higher Education Support Act 2003* (HESA) that have been paid to the University to the end of 2004 is \$17.7 million. Payments made to the University over the same period to assist students to pay their tuition fees and student contributions (HECS) have totalled \$9.6 million.

- c) and d)
 - Funding estimates for forward years are not available by programme for individual institutions, except for the Capital Development Pool.
 - In 2006 the University of Notre Dame will receive \$2 million for the Medical School at the Fremantle campus. From 2005 to 2008 the University of Notre Dame will receive \$4 million for refurbishment and development of the Broadway and Darlinghurst sites for the Sydney campus. This campus will include a medical school.
- e) The estimates for the HELP programme over the forward estimates period are not broken down by institution. Estimates for 2005 are in the attached table.
- f) The University of Notre Dame Australia is required under Division 19 of HESA to comply with the quality and accountability requirements of the Australian Government. These requirements apply to all approved higher education providers. They include the submission of annual audited financial statements, provision of statistical and other information and adherence to fairness provisions. The University of Notre Dame Australia is also subject to quality audit. A report of the audit conducted by the

g) The University is required to prepare its annual financial statements in accordance with the Australian Accounting Standards and the Department's guidelines for the preparation of annual financial statements. The University is required to include revenue from all sources, including private sources, in its annual financial statements.
