Additional Estimates Hearing - 17 February 2005

I would like to correct a comment made by me in reply to a question from Senator Marshall when the Australian Industrial Registry appeared before the Committee on 17 February 2005 (refer Hansard EWRE pp 114 - 117).

Senator Marshall asked me several questions relating to the AIRC's centenary dinner celebrations, some of which were taken on notice and will be responded to in the usual manner. At page 117, I was asked a question about whether former ACTU President and Prime Minister Bob Hawke was invited. I replied that he was not and commented that "[i]t simply was not an event which took us to former ACTU presidents or, for that matter, former ACCI presidents".

I realised after the Committee hearing that an invitation to attend the function was issued to Mr George Polites, a former Director-General of the Confederation of Australian Industry, which was a predecessor organisation of ACCI. The invitation was issued relatively close to the date of the dinner and was partly related to Mr Polites' being the father of Senior Deputy President Colin Polites who died in office during 2003.

I apologise for the oversight in not drawing this to the Committee's attention during the hearing.

This correspondence is to advise you that during my appearance before the Employment, Workplace Relations and Education Legislation Committee for Additional Estimates on Thursday, 17 February 2005, I provided a response to a question to Senator Allison that has subsequently been found to be incorrect.

At page EWRE 43 of the Hansard the following questions were asked by Senator Allison:

Senator ALLISON—So it is a kind of costs-plus contract, is it?

Mr Armstrong—Yes, that is correct. There was an initial cost and now they are billing us on hourly rates for the work that they actually do on SEESA.

Senator ALLISON—Is there a cap or an estimate that they are working to?

Mr Armstrong—No.

The last of my response to Senator Allison's question: "Is there a cap or an estimate that they are working to?" was not correct. The response should have been:

"Yes, there is a cap, the total fee payable to SEES Pty Ltd for its services are not to exceed 1% of the total eligible employee entitlement payments made."

I would also note that the Group Manager, Workplace Relations Services, Ms Connell, subsequently provided an answer based on my incorrect response. Ms Connell's response, at page EWRE 43 of the Hansard, to Senator Alison's question was as follows:

Senator ALLISON—Yes. Is it an open-ended contract or is there a limit?

Ms Connell—No, it is a contract where we have a list of tasks that are required to be fulfilled and we pay SEES on an hourly basis.

It should also be noted that Ms Connell's response would need to be read in the context of my correction.

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It would be appreciated if you could note the records of the Committee that a correction has been made and advise Senator Allison of the correct response.
