There is a break in series between 2000 and 2001, both with the field of education classification and the reporting period. From 2001 onwards, the Australian Standard Classification of Education (ASCED) is used to categorise the field of education, prior to 2001 the Field of Study classification was used. Prior to 2001, student numbers reflect students undertaking units of study at 31 March of the reference year. From 2001, student numbers reflect students undertaking units of study over the period 1 September to 31 August of the reference year. This change in scope in 2001 resulted in a sharp increase in reported enrolments between 2000 and 2001.
