Science Investment Process - criteria

Among the several criteria used to assess CSIRO's research priorities during the Science Investment Process, those listed below related to CSIRO's competitive advantage and the potential for creating significant impact:

Relevance to Australia

- Significant potential benefit for Australia
- Delivery of science and technology is key to producing outcomes
- Builds important capability in CSIRO with broad applicability
- Results in valuable additional benefits (e.g. reputation enhancement, Australian global positioning)

Likely Impact

- Distinctive (and differentiated) science
- Researchers' track record of delivery over the last 5 years, including delivery of scientific outcomes
- Science "hotspot"
- Appropriate leadership capacity
- Appropriate investment level
