#### Answer:

Compliance of provider with the ESOS Act 2000

On 17 February 2005, the overseas students National Liaison Committee (NLC) wrote to the Minister concerning allegations made by two students of the registered provider, Education Access (Australia) Pty Ltd, trading as the Melbourne Institute of Tourism and Hospitality (MITH). The allegations concerned the manner and processes adopted by MITH in reporting some students via this Department's Provider Registration and International Students Management System, as required under the ESOS Act.

The Department investigated these allegations. The information provided to the Department indicated that the processes and procedures of MITH were compliant with the ESOS Act and its National Code.
