CSIRO maintains 11 national collections. Where are these collections located? What is the budget for each of these collections?

CSIRO has provided the following response:

National collections

CSIRO manages a portfolio of biological collections which were developed for various research and related purposes. Four of these collections make up the scientifically and nationally significant CSIRO National Biological Collections which the organisation manages on behalf of the Australian Government. There are other collections of flora and fauna in CSIRO developed for various research and related purposes the more significant of which include the Australian Tree Seed Centre, the CSIRO Collection of Living Microalgae, the Wood-inhabiting fungi collection, the Dadswell Memorial Wood Collection and the CSIRO Mycology Herbarium.
