# Question:

Australian Technical Colleges

- 1. Australian Technical Colleges (ATCs):
  - a. How many ATCs are now operational?
  - b. How many students are enrolled in each of those?
  - c. Are those enrolments in each case reaching the targets or predictions contained in QON answer 3755, tabled in the House on 30 October last year?
- 2. Eastern Melbourne College:
  - a. How many students are enrolled in the Eastern Melbourne College?
  - b. The target for 2007 was 180. How many are there?
- 3. Gladstone College:
  - a. The target for 2007 was 65. How many do you have there?
  - b. Do you expect to reach the projected enrolment of 135 by 2009?
  - c. How many do you expect in Gladstone by 2011?
