## Question:

Senator Marshall asked at Hansard page 16:
Retrenched TCF workers. Please provide an analysis of the jobs found by retrenched TCF workers and how long these people lasted in the jobs.

## Answer:

The Department tracks job seekers only for the first 26 weeks after placement into employment. As at 9 March 2007 there were 303 retrenched TCF workers who have been employed for at least 13 weeks. 143 retrenched TCF workers have been employed for at least 26 weeks.

As at 9 March 2007 retrenched TCF workers have been placed into jobs as follows:
