Please table the terms of reference for the Employment Relations backbench committee. b) who are the members? c) how many meetings has each member attended? d) what were the times of these meetings? e) what were the costs involved in running these meetings and having members attend? (eg travel, accommodation, catering, venue hire) f) please table the agendas and minutes since the formation of the committee g) what is the committee meant to achieve) h) what suggestions have been received so far?
