## **Background**

1. Expenditure under the ESL-NA Program for the 2005-07 program years, plus projected expenditure for 2008, is detailed in Table 1.

These figures are estimates only based on the initial 2008 per capita funding rates and estimated enrolments. Under current arrangements the per capita rates will be supplemented late in 2008 to ensure they are maintained real terms.

- (2) 2008 figures are estimates only. The ESL-NA Program is demand driven with all eligible students receiving assistance. In accordance with ESL-NA Program Guidelines, initial claims in respect of the actual number of eligible students will not be received from education authorities until August 2008, with second (final) claims received in early December 2008.
- (3) The estimated number of humanitarian students eligible for ESL-NA Program assistance is similar to previous years as the Commonwealth Government's Humanitarian Migration Program has been maintained at 13,000 places since 2004-05.
