General Employee Entitlements and Redundancy Scheme (GEERS)

Question 1

During the 2008/2009 financial year the Department advised that 15,753 claims had been received. Please provide a current figure?

Answer

Over the period 1 July 2009 to 31 January 2010, the Department received 10,947 claims for GEERS assistance.

Question 2

Please provide an updated list indicating from what sectors these claims have originated?

Answer

The table below lists the number of GEERS claims received by industry sector over the period 1 July 2009 to 31 January 2010.

Question 3

What is the amount of the average claim paid out by GEERS?

Answer

Over the period 1 July 2009 to 31 January 2010, the average amount of GEERS assistance paid for a claim was \$10,036.76

Question 4

What is the current number of staff working on the processing of GEERS claims and how does this compare to 6 months ago?

Answer

As at 31 January 2010, 88 staff were employed in the Employee Entitlements Branch, of which approximately 67* staff were directly involved in the assessment of GEERS claims. This compares to 78 staff as at 31 July 2009, of which 57* staff were directly involved in the assessment of GEERS claims.
