Question

EMPLOYMENT ASSISTANCE & INCOME SUPPORT

Please provide data on the overall number, characteristics, and employment outcomes of unemployed people who participated in the Work experience phase of Job Services Australia (within each Stream and overall) over the year ending September 2010, in the same format (and with the same breakdown of characteristics and outcomes) as in the latest Labour Market Assistance Outcomes publication.

Answer

Labour Market Assistance Outcomes data (December 2010) relate to job seekers who participated in Job Services Australia in the 12 months between 1 October 2009 and 30 September 2010. Outcomes are measured 3 months after the job seekers has participated in assistance under Job Services Australia. It should be noted that for this 12 month period, the majority of job seekers in assistance under JSA were participating in Stream Services. At the start of JSA on 1 July 2009, the number of job seekers who moved directly into the Work Experience phase, as part of the transition arrangements, was very small.

Table 1 shows the outcomes of job seekers who participated in the Work Experience phase for Streams 2 to 4 combined. Stream 1 job seekers did not enter the Work Experience phase until JSA had been operating for 12 months, as such there were insufficient survey responses for Stream 1 job seekers for this period. The numbers of job seekers by individual Streams, Stream 2 to 4, were combined to produce statistically reliable outcomes data for the Work Experience phase for the period specified.

As the JSA model is further established and matures, the number of job seekers participating in the Work Experience phase will progressively increase as job seekers complete 12 months in Stream Services and move into the Work Experience phase
