ACARA - NAPLAN (allegations of cheating)

Senator MASON: When states and territories set and administer the tests, are you aware of any allegations of cheating? Dr. Hill: I do not have any information about that. I actually was not in Australia when this was happening, so I do not have any personal corporate memory of it. I do not know whether Mr Adams does. CHAIR: It definitely was not you, Dr Hill. Senator MASON: Do you, gentlemen—Mr Randall or Mr Adams? Prior to September 2008, when we had examinations administered by state and territory governments, were there allegations of cheating? Mr Adams: That would be a question we would have to ask states and territories because we do not have information on that. I imagine that it would exist, but it is not part of our data because it predates our involvement. Anecdotally, I would have thought the answer would be yes, but we do not have data on that. That would be state and territory based. Senator MASON: If you can get it for the committee, that would be great. I
