Question

Aussie Jobs, Looking Back, Looking Forward

In relation to the publication Aussie Jobs, Looking Back, Looking Forward: Who commissioned this publication? What was the cost of preparing the publication - including a full breakdown? Why does the booklet only contain information from 2007-2013? Why didn't the Department include long term unemployment figures? Why didn't the Department include the employment to population ratio? Why didn't the publication make any mention of the Government's promise to create half a million new jobs? Was this publication approved by the Minister's office as drafted by the Department? When did work commence on the publication?

Answer

1. Who commissioned this publication?

The Department of Education, Employment and Workplace Relations commissioned the publication.

2. What was the cost of preparing the publication? Including a full breakdown?

There were no costs involved in the drafting and design of the publication. Five hundred copies of the booklet were printed, with printing costs totaling \$2493.85 (GST exclusive).

3. Why does the booklet only contain information from 2007-2013?

The objective of *Aussie Jobs, Looking Back, Looking Forward* was to provide a summary of employment growth by industry and occupation over the past five years (using ABS Labour Force Survey data for the period 2007-2012), and for the five years to 2016-17 (using DEEWR's latest employment projections).

4. Why didn't the Department include long term unemployment figures?

The purpose of the publication was to provide information on past and projected employment growth by industry and occupation. Long-term unemployment figures are outside this scope.

5. Why didn't the Department include the employment to population ratio?

The purpose of the publication was to provide information on past and projected employment growth by industry and occupation. The employment to population ratio is outside this scope.

6. Why didn't the publication make any mention of the Government's promise to create half a million new jobs?

The purpose of the publication was to provide information on past and projected employment growth by industry and occupation. Government statements on job creation are outside this scope.

7. Was this publication approved by the Minister's Office as drafted by the Department?

Yes.

8. When did work commence on the publication?

Work commenced on the publication in September 2012.
