Question

NAPLAN withdrawal rates Australia-wide

An article, "Stressed kids miss tests: NAPLAN boycotts" by Jessica Marszalek, appeared on page 10 of the Herald Sun on Saturday 24 November 2012. Citing research and analysis by economist Trevor Cobbold, the article indicated that, in relation to 2012 NAPLAN testing, 11 schools in Victoria had student withdrawal rates over 75%, four Victorian schools had withdrawal rates of 50-75% and 11 Victorian schools had 25-50% withdrawal rates.

a) How many schools Australia-wide had over 50% of students withdraw from NAPLAN in 2012?

Answer

The Australian Curriculum, Assessment & Reporting Authority has provided the following response.

Student withdrawals are initiated at the parent/carer's request, and there is no requirement for a reason to be provided. Test Administration Authorities in states and territories each have their own process for managing withdrawals. ACARA does not request or receive qualitative information on this process or reasons for withdrawal. Reasons can include, but are not limited to, philosophical or religious objections to testing.
