Senator Carr asked on 5 June 2003

Question:

“The package proposes limitations on the number of years a student would be eligible for a Commonwealth-subsidised place and access to HECS – a limit of five years.

- a) What about combined degrees?
- b) What about those who, in effect, do a combined degree but who actually complete one degree and then immediately enrol for another, with some credit and subject exemptions?

Answer:

Learning entitlements – combined degrees

- a) The Learning Entitlement provides students in a Commonwealth supported place with the equivalent of five years of full time study and may be extended beyond five years to support students who are undertaking an initial undergraduate course or pathway in which the normal enrolment period is longer than five years (for example medicine at undergraduate or graduate degree levels or double degree with honours).
- b) The circumstances in which the 5 year Learning Entitlement may be extended are yet to be settled in detail.
