Question:

1. Please explain the occupations covered by “targeting women in non-traditional occupations incentive”?
2. Was this different pre-budget axing of certain incentives?

Answer:

Women in Non-Traditional New Apprenticeships Incentive

1) The occupations covered by the “targeting women in non-traditional occupations incentive” are those which are traditionally male occupations and which have generally only attracted small numbers of women. A list of occupations for which there is training which attracts the Women in Non-Traditional New Apprenticeships (WNTNA) Incentive is at Attachment A.

2) The 2002 New Apprenticeships Incentives Programme Review recommended that the Department of Education, Science and Training work with the Office of Status of Women to assess whether the list of qualifications eligible to attract the WNTNA incentive was still relevant. One hundred and thirty-five qualifications related to the cooking, hospitality, cleaning and retail industries were made ineligible to attract the WNTNA incentive as part of the 2004 Budget. There are over 1,100 remaining qualifications eligible to attract the WNTNA incentive. These provide pathways in occupations such as engineering, automotive, construction, plumbing, security, agriculture, electro technology, telecommunications, entertainment, IT and transport.
