# Media Release HELPING SCHOOLS TO FLY THE FLAG WITH \$1500 GRANT

#### 25 January 2005 MIN 1041/05

To ensure every Australian school has a flagpole, the Australian Government will make available up to \$1500 for individual schools to either purchase or repair a flagpole.

Some schools do not have a flagpole while others have an existing flagpole in disrepair.

Our flag reflects who we are, where we have come from and the historical circumstances and values of those who have passed on an economic and social legacy to our generation.

By taking pride in the flag and its presentation, schools can help support parents' expectations that our schools will foster values such as tolerance, trustworthiness, mutual respect, courage, compassion, courtesy and doing one's best.

Education is as much about building character as it is transferring skills, knowledge and the thirst for learning

The Howard Government considers the flying of the Australian flag an important part of promoting values education in Australian schools and has made it a condition of receiving funding which over the next four years will see a record \$33 billion provided by the Government to support all schools.

Of this important commitment to schooling, almost \$35 million will be allocated to support values education and civics and citizenship education programmes in Australian schools over the next four years.
