## Answer:

CSIRO has provided the following response.

Staff moves or transfers over next 3 years

CSIRO has developed and is implementing a strategy to achieve the most effective use of its infrastructure investment via consolidation of sites and co-location with universities and other research institutions. Planned relocations and affected staff numbers for the period from July 2005 to July 2008 are provided in the table below.

Note that two other relocations, the consolidation of the sites at Highett and Aspendale at Clayton, are already planned but will not take place until 2009.

In addition to site consolidation, movement from one research area to another regularly occurs in CSIRO as part of the normal business processes. This may involve small numbers of staff being asked to transfer both intra and inter city. CSIRO also accommodates requests by staff to transfer for personal reasons where this meets our operational needs.
