Question:

Senator Wong asked at *Hansard* page 13:

What are the assumptions about people who will move into work without access to any of those services on which the *Welfare to Work* package is based?

Answer:

It was estimated that 1.5% of Parenting Payment customers who will face new requirements would find employment without accessing services.

It was estimated that 2% of mature aged customers who will face new or increased requirements and not already participating in Job Network will leave payment without accessing services.

Customers finding employment without accessing services

Newstart Allowance	0	82	99

For people with a disability and for the very long term unemployed, it was estimated that no customers would move into work without access to services.
