Question:

- a) Please indicate the level of funding for Australian Technical Colleges in Western Australia in 2006-07 and the period of the forward estimates (broken down by year).
- b) Given that the WA Australian Technical Colleges may be delivered through non-government organisations, in partnership with local government, please indicate the level of funding provided to those organisations by the Commonwealth, broken down by capital and program funding and by year, for 2006-07 and over the period of the forward estimates? Please also explain how the funding formula for the WA colleges is arrived at.
- c) Please indicate how many student places will be provided by Australian Technical Colleges in WA in 2006-07 and over the period of the forward estimates, broken down by year, and indicate how many of those places will be funded by the Commonwealth.

Answer:

(a), (b) and (c) A funding agreement has been signed to establish the Australian Technical College – Perth South. A funding agreement for the Pilbara is still under negotiation and so the detail of arrangements cannot be provided as they are yet to be confirmed.
