**Question:**

Senator Wong asked in writing:

Can the OEA provide a breakdown of AWAs it has examined in its sampling process by: a) casual b) full time c) part time? And can the OEA divide those AWAs it has examined in its sampling process into source regions?

**Answer:**

The sample of 250 Australian workplace agreements covered 64 casual employees, 44 part-time employees and 139 full-time employees (247 employees).

On the basis of the employee location, the sample of 250 AWAs is distributed as follows:
