## Question:

**Senator CARR**—Returning to the technical colleges, can you provide me with advice as to how these trade training contracts are arranged with third parties? Could you provide that by whether it is a private RTO, a group training provider or a TAFE college? If it is a TAFE college then we could have a reasonable expectation that the standard of facilities is appropriate.

## Answer:

Australian Technical Colleges

Each Australian Technical College has made a decision about the most appropriate way to deliver trade training, reflecting the needs and conditions of the local industry and community. A range of models exist, including the College being a Registered Training Organisation (RTO), the College contracting a private RTO or TAFE or a mixture of the above.
