#### **ESTIMATES HEARINGS** SCOPE OF QUESTIONING

You asked for a note on the suggestion that questions in estimates hearings cannot be asked about past activities of departments and agencies.

The resolution of the Senate of November 1999, which is referred to in chairs' opening statements, declares that all questions going to the operations and financial positions of departments and agencies are relevant questions in estimates hearings. The resolution does not confine questions to *current* operations. If the Senate had then intended to confine questions to current operations it would have done so by explicit terms in the resolution. Obviously past activities of departments and agencies can illuminate current activities.

I add that there is nothing in the rules of the Senate to prevent questions being asked about the nature of current legal proceedings and the matters in issue in those proceedings.

A claim by a witness that information should not be provided because it is normally confidential elsewhere should be considered by the committee as a claim of public interest immunity, that is, whether any harm to a public interest is a likely consequence of the provision of the information. It is not a matter for a ruling by the chair.
