Dear John

Thank you for the opportunity to meet with you regarding the exchange of work between the ABCC and the OWS.

I agree that the volume of work likely to be exchanged in either direction will most probably be fairly low. Because of this estimation, we both hold the view that it is not necessary to enter into a detailed formal agreement on the subject. Instead we are agreed that the exchange of work can probably be dealt with through some key agreements of principle.

In relation to matters which are commenced within the ABCC's jurisdiction and which need to be referred to OWS:

1. The OWS role will be to investigate those elements of the matter which fall into the definition of "prescribed provisions within the meaning of the "Directions to Inspectors" given by the Minister for Employment and Workplace Relations (and dated 27 March 2006 FRLI F2006L00983).
2. OWS' investigation of such matters will be in accordance with its usual policies and procedures.
3. The OWS will keep the ABCC informed of progress with its investigation.
4. The OWS investigation of matters referred by ABCC will be commenced by the relevant ABCC officer contacting Alfred Bonggi, Deputy Director, telephone (02) 612, 3074, alfred.bonggi@ows.gov.au.

In relation to matters which come to the OWS which are not referred by the ABCC, and which relate to "building work" as defined by the Building and Construction Industry Improvement Act 2005, the OWS will discuss with the ABCC which agency should have carriage of the matter. This will be done by the OWS contact office speaking with Bill Clarke, Legal Manager, telephone (02) 8255 8003, bill.clarke@abcc.gov.au at the ABCC about the circumstances of the case.

If, at any time, there is disagreement between our staff about how a particular matter should be dealt with, you and I will discuss and resolve the disagreement.

OWS will keep a record of matters referred in either direction and will provide periodic reports about the workload.

I trust that this adequately sets out a means for handling the mutual exchange of work. Should there need to be any additions or alterations to these principles, please let me know.
